 Last month, the Helping Paws newsletter featured a story about six dogs from a facility in Ohio that was overwhelmed by a hoarding situation. When the dogs arrived at Helping Paws, they were suffering from eye and ear infections as well as secondary skin infections causing them to lose most of their fur. From the beginning, the team at Helping Paws wanted to surround these dogs with a positive attitude. No longer referred to as the "hoarder dogs;" they were promptly dubbed the Ohio-6 including Prince, Diamond, Hope, Spirit, Magic, and Treasure.

The Ohio-6 are much healthier now. Thanks to treatment provided by Helping Paws Veterinary Team including Supervisor, Judy Treptow, the infections are gone, and the fur is growing back. Staff and volunteers also played a part in restoring these dogs to health. They worked with the dogs to provide socialization and helped the dogs learn about pottying outside and walking on a leash. Eager to please, the Ohio-6 made wonderful progress and continue to do so.

We are happy to announce that three of the Ohio-6 have found their "fur-ever" families. Magic, Treasure, and Prince have been adopted.

Magic continues to go by the same name. He was adopted by Dominic and his girlfriend Carla who say he's got a ton of energy. Magic loves to play with tennis balls, go for walks, sniff everything, and chew on toys. He's a little frightened by strange noises and the vacuum cleaner, but getting used to his surroundings more each day. Soon, this little cutie will be participating in puppy training class.

Murphy, formerly known as Treasure, was adopted by Peggy and her daughter Judi. Murphy now has 3 feline siblings, and all seems to be getting along well. 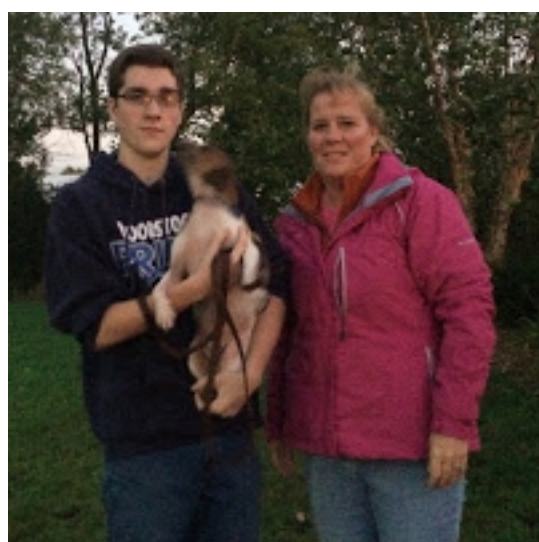
"I Want A Forever Home" Quilt Raffle

What a wonderful gift to give or keep for yourself!

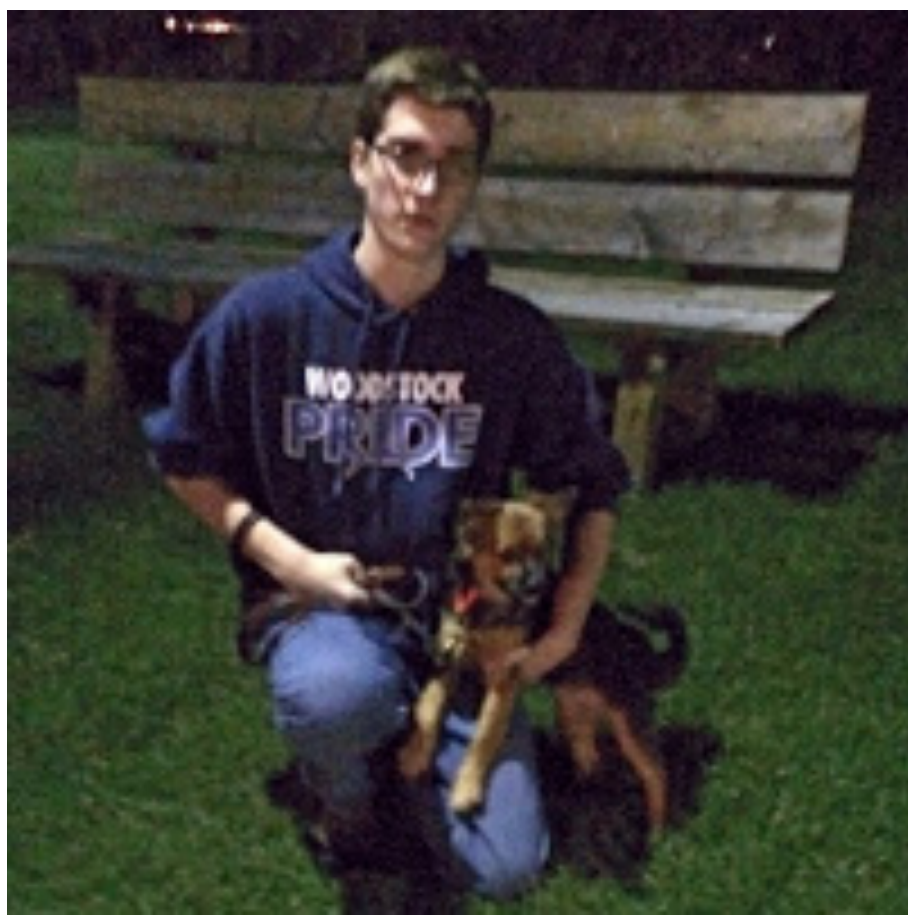
Volunteer Spotlight

Oreo

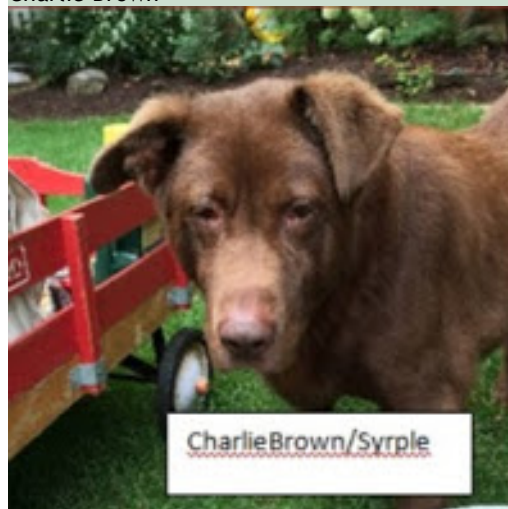
